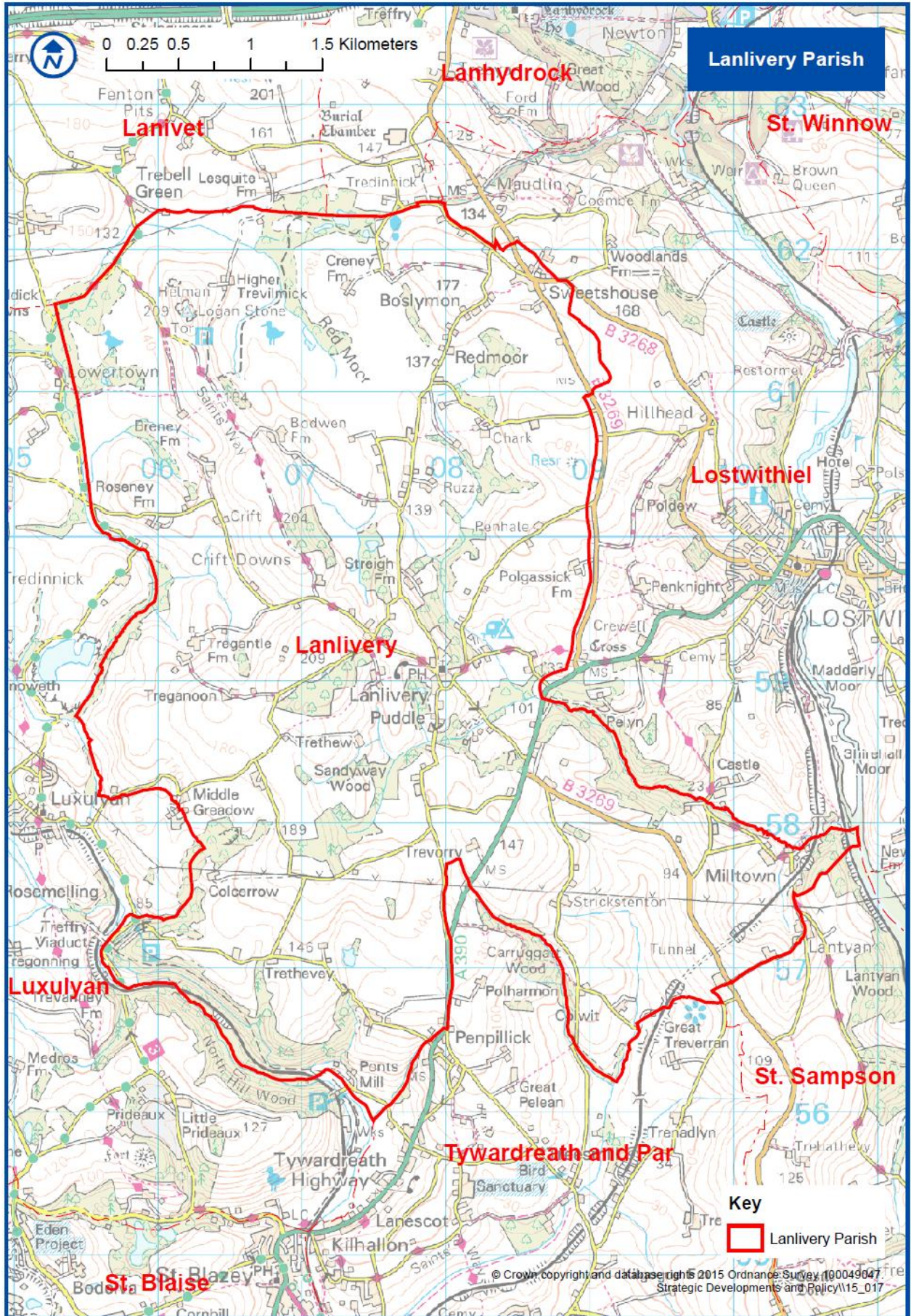

A NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN FOR LANLIVERY

Lanlivery Parish Council is working towards producing a neighbourhood plan for our parish. This is a community led framework for putting in place planning policies for future development and growth. If successful it will become part of the statutory development plan for the area. This means it will have real legal force and carry far more weight than the parish plan currently in use.

WHAT IS A NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN?

A neighbourhood plan is a community-led framework for guiding the future development, regeneration and conservation of an area. A neighbourhood plan is about the use and development of land and may contain a vision, aims, planning policies, proposals for improving the area or providing new facilities or allocation of key sites for specific kinds of development. It may deal with a wide range of social, economic and environmental issues (such as housing, employment, heritage and transport) or it may focus on one or two issues only.

A neighbourhood plan will be part of the statutory development plan for the area, if successful at referendum. This statutory status gives neighbourhood plans far more weight than some other local documents, such as parish plans, community plans and village design statements. It means that Parish Councils and Cornwall Council must take it into account when making planning decisions.

Once a neighbourhood plan has been completed, it will have to be submitted to Cornwall Council and then be subjected to an independent examination. This will make sure that the proper legal process has been followed and that the plan meets the basic conditions, including general conformity with strategic local policy. During this time the plan will also be publicised to those who live and work in the parish. The neighbourhood plan will then be

subject to a public referendum in which it will be necessary to gain a more than 50% 'yes' vote of those voting in a public referendum in order to bring it into force.

A successful neighbourhood plan, once in force, will form part of the statutory development plan for the parish and therefore, any planning decisions within the area of the plan need to be made in accordance with it.

Neighbourhood plans must be community led. This means that your views are vitally important throughout the process. This questionnaire will give the steering group a clear idea of how those who live and work in the parish would like to see it develop, and you will also have the opportunity to add comments and ideas as we progress and finally to vote on whether or not to formally adopt the final plan.
