26/80 Reports from Parish Council Representatives

CALC Cllr Green reported

- CALC are running an alternate programme to CC about NPS.
- They have also announced a programme to help to mitigate fly tipping and have requested input from parishes. Anybody reporting fly tipping to CC please c.c. her in and she will pass the information on to CALC.
- Cornwall Council is leading on an initiative 'Building Local Benefits through Community Energy.'

26/81 Playing Field

Members considered quotes supplied to Ross Morcom for the safety surfacing of the playground. The Parish Clerk confirmed that Ross had queried the cheaper quote as he considered that the 2-3mm tolerance stated was extreme and could not be achieved and they had not included regulating in the quote. An updated quote had been requested but had yet to arrive. The other quote was complete and members noted that it was from a local company and that both Ross and the Parish Clerk had used them previously and found them to be excellent. As time was pressing if the work was to be done before the winter Cllr Sinkins proposed, Cllr Haley seconded and it was **RESOLVED** that the quote from DA Giles should be approved in principle if the other quote was not received or was found to be unacceptable. The Parish Clerk also reported that Ross was ready to install the equipment and this would be done before the safety surfacing was laid. However, once he began work the whole playground site would have to be closed and fenced off until the project was completed and until a contractor was appointed for the surfacing the lead-in time for this would not be known. Members accepted that this may result in the facilities being unavailable for longer than strictly necessary, but given the onset of winter it was agreed that Ross should be authorised to install the equipment and erect harras fencing to secure the site. Suitable notices would need to be displayed to satisfy risk assessment requirements. Thanks were again recorded to Ross for agreeing to do this work free of charge. Members noted that the school had promised to give a donation towards the equipment but this had not yet been received. Cllr Haley agreed to follow up on this.

26/82 Forest Field

National Grid had finished the undergrounding of the electric cables. A response from the school requesting details of the underground cable they had installed to their outside classroom without authorisation from the Parish Council was still awaited. Cllr Sinkins noted that the area allocated for the orchard needed strimming. Cllr Green had visited the Par Community Orchard and reported that there were about 25 trees there but that the site was very open to south westerly winds; this would not be the case in Lanlivery. Cllr Green had identified some funding opportunities and would follow up on an application to Forest for Cornwall. Cllr Preece had offered a grant from her Community Chest and the Parish Clerk would submit this application when costings for the trees, stakes etc. had been obtained.

26/83 Neighbourhood Priorities Statement

Cllr Sinkins proposed, Cllr Hemmings seconded and it was **RESOLVED** that the Terms of Reference for the NPS Steering Group, which were agreed at

their inaugural meeting, be approved. The meeting notes from this meeting were noted.

26/84 Planning

1. PA26/05469. NGED have received a request to upgrade the existing supply to three phase. This will require a third wire to be erected on the existing high voltage overhead line for 9 spans from pole 43KAS16 to 43KAS24A, totalling approximately 720M, highlighted in green on the plan CE6152070SECT37. There will also be a requirement to erect two stay wires on pole 43KAS24, to support the line and a lazy leg pole next to pole 43KAS24A to support the larger transformer, both highlighted in pink on the plan. An underground cable will be connected from the transformer, shown as the brown line on the plan. Creny Farm, Redmoor, PL30 5AP. It was proposed by Cllr Wright, seconded Cllr Hemmings and RESOLVED that a recommendation of no objection should be made to Cornwall Council.

26/85 Reports from Councillors

Cllr Paterson reported that the potholes recently filled by Cornwall Council in the road from Penpillick to Colligreen were already failing again.
